



## Philippa Howden-Chapman

Professor of Public Health  
at the University of Otago

Philippa Howden-Chapman, sesquicentennial distinguished professor of public health at the University of Otago, Wellington, New Zealand, is co-director of He Kāinga Oranga/ Housing and Health Research Programme, director of the NZ Centre for Sustainable Cities and the WHO Collaborating Centre on Housing and Wellbeing. Her work focuses on reducing inequalities in the determinants of health and wellbeing. She has conducted randomised community housing trials in partnership with local communities, which have had a major influence on housing, urban policy and health nationally and internationally.

She is a director on the board of the Crown Entity Kāinga Ora-homes and communities, a fellow of the Royal Society of NZ and former chair of the International Science Council Committee, Urban Health and Wellbeing: a systems approach. She has received numerous awards, including the Prime Minister's Science Team Prize and the Royal Society of NZ Rutherford Medal. She was awarded a Queen's Service Order and for contributions to public health a Companion of the NZ Order of Merit.
